



# Merlin Rocket 76<sup>th</sup> National Championships Mounts Bay 31<sup>st</sup> July – 4th August 2022

#### **NOTICE OF RACE**

#### 1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the RYA Racing Charter.
- 1.2 Any amendment to this Notice of Race will be posted on the MROA website no later than 1st July 2022.
- 1.3 The Exoneration Penalty and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes procedures shall apply (for information on the procedures, go to www.rya.org.uk/go/rulesdisputes). The outcome of an RYA Arbitration can be referred to a protest committee, but an arbitration cannot be reopened or appealed.
- 1.4 Sail numbers are not required on spinnakers

#### 2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 Sailing Instructions (SI) will be available from the MROA website no later than 18th July 2022.
- 2.2 At the discretion of the Organising Authority, draft Sailing Instructions may be released earlier on the MROA website.

#### 3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The official noticeboard location will be published with the Sailing Instructions and may be online.
- 3.2 All competitors are strongly advised to join a WhatsApp group for the event which may be used to draw attention to Notices to Competitors and other event information.
- 3.3 [DP] Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communications not available to all boats.

# 4. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to boats of the Merlin Rocket class with a valid measurement certificate and whose helm is a current member of the MROA at the time of the event.
- 4.2 The maximum entry is limited to 100 boats.
- 4.3 Eligible boats may enter by submitting a completed entry form and paying the appropriate entry fee via the SailRacer website or links from the MROA website.
- 4.4 Entry will close on 18th July 2022. Later entries may be accepted subject to payment of an additional fee.
- 4.5 Helms and crews less than 18 years of age during the event shall submit signed Parent/Guardian Declarations at the time of entry.

#### **5. ENTRY FEES**

#### 5.1 Entry Fee per boat:

Loyalty Bonus (2021 Champs Entrants) Form received, and entry paid by 1st July 2022	£250
Standard Entry – Form received, and entry paid by 1 <sup>s</sup> July 2022	£275
Late Entry – Form received, and entry fee paid from 2nd July 2022	£300

The MROA are offering the following discounts on the above fees. Entrants may claim one from each category. All discounts are £50 off the normal price except that late entries will not be eligible.

#### Category 1:

- Helm under 25
- First time helm or crew. (Never competed at MR champs as helm or crew)
- Old boat (Sail number 3603 and older)

## Category 2:

- Crew Under 25
- Entry eligible for Henderson Cup or Ball and Chain Trophy (See section 20)
- Helms address as recorded in the yearbook 300 or more miles from Mounts Bay SC (Fastest route on Google maps)

#### 6. CREW LIMITATIONS

6.1 Merlin Rocket Class Rules will apply.

#### 7. ADVERTISING

- 7.1 Advertising shall comply with WS Regulation 20 and the Merlin Rocket Class Rules.
- 7.2 Boats may be required to display event-supplied competitor advertising as per the Class Rule C.4.1.
- 7.3 The area of mainsail below the bottom batten shall be reserved for advertising by the event sponsor.

No warning signal will be made after 15:00 on Thursday 4th August 2022 unless fewer than three races have been completed in the series.

#### 9. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 9.1 Boats may be subject to pre-event measurement checks at the times prescribed in "NoR 8. Event Schedule".
- 9.2 Additional measurement checks may be carried out at any time during the event.
- 9.3 The measuring authority is the Royal Yachting Association.
- 9.4 Entrants will be required to produce a valid RYA Measurement Certificate at Inspection and Registration
- 9.5 The fact that race officials may conduct inspections of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor set out in this Notice of Race.

#### 10. CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

10.1 RRS 50.1 will apply

#### 11. VENUE

11.1 Racing will take place in Mounts Bay (otherwise known as Penzance Bay) to the south of St Michael's Mount.

#### 12. COURSES

- 12.1 Example courses are at Appendix 1. At the discretion of the Race Committee, gate starts may be employed
- 12.2 The expected race target time for the lead boat to finish will be;
  - (a) 70 minutes when one race is scheduled (and for the Ranelagh Trophy race if run on a day when two races are scheduled).
  - (b) 60 minutes when two races are scheduled.
  - (c) 50 minutes when three races are scheduled.

#### 13. PENALTY SYSTEM

13.1 Appendix P shall apply as modified by the Sailing Instructions.

# 14. SCORING

- 14.1 The Scoring System will be as follows:
  - (a) Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
  - (b) When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
  - (c) When five or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
  - (d) When nine races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 14.2 The Crews' Race, if sailed, will not form part of the scoring series.

#### **15. SUPPORT BOATS**

- 15.1 [DP] Support boats shall register at the Race Office at the time prescribed in NoR 5 and shall be responsible for payment of any launching fees direct to the appropriate authority.
- 15.2 [DP] Support boats shall, at all times, remain clear of the race area unless specifically directed by the Race Officer or Event Safety Officer.
- 15.3 [DP] Support boats shall carry a VHF radio and monitor Channel 37A (M1) for communications from the Race Committee.
- 15.4 The Jury boat will display IC flag "J".

#### 16. BERTHING/LAUNCHING

16.1[DP] Boats shall be berthed on their launching trollies in their assigned places in the boat park.

16.2 [DP]Launching and recovery will be from the beach in front of the MBSC clubhouse. When leaving and returning to the launching area, boats shall pass to the west of St Michael's Mount. Boats shall, at all times, keep clear of the route of the ferry boats operating between St Michael's Mount and the mainland.

#### 17. PRIVACY STATEMENT

17.1 The personal information you provide to the Organising Authority will be used to facilitate your participation in the event. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the event (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the Organising Authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA, your national authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.

#### **18. RISK STATEMENT**

18.1 Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.'

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

#### 19. INSURANCE

19.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 per incident or the equivalent thereof.

Minima Trophy	First female competitor sailing in the same boat throughout the championship.				
Amazons cup	First female helm.				
Neil Henderson Cup	First helm and crew related by birth or marriage sailing in the same boat throughout the championship				
Ball and Chain Trophy	First boat sailed by a couple not married or related by birth sailing in the same boat throughout the championship				
Heavyweights prize	First helm and crew with a combined weight of 26 stone (165kg) or more sailing in the same boat throughout the championships.				
Triangle Team Trophy	Club scoring the lowest total points with their best three boats sailed by the same three helms throughout the championships				
Buttercup Trophy	Lowest placed boat having completed all qualifying races in the series (i.e. all races sailed)				
Old boats prize	First boat with sail number 3603 or below.				
Looe Board	Most cheerful competitors as judged by the host club.				

Where qualification for a trophy is age dependant, ages are to be taken as on the 31st July 2022.

Should the entry exceed 30 boats, the fleet will be split into Gold, Silver and Bronze fleets and the following trophies awarded, results to be taken from the overall series and not extracted and scored separately:

Jack Holt Plate	Highest placed boat in Silver Fleet.
Maurice Cockerill Trophy	Highest placed boat in Bronze fleet.

Sparkling wine will be awarded to the first 21 boats to finish the Ranelagh Race.

Glassware will be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority, details to be published with the sailing instructions.

## 21. FURTHER INFORMATION

21.1 COVID 19

- 21.1(a) [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable request from an event official. Failure to comply may be misconduct. Reasonable actions by event officials to implement COVID-19 guidance, protocols or legislation, even if they later prove to have been unnecessary, are not improper actions or omissions.
- 21.1(b) In the event of a cancellation due to circumstances beyond the control of the Organising Authority any financial liability is limited to the entry fee paid.


